Alarm Registration

Unnecessary Police dispatches cost police departments tens of thousands of dollars each year. To manage the number of police dispatches, many municipalities now require that the owners of a security alarm system register the alarm system. The registration process is called CryWolf. Alarm companies no longer can provide this service.

A false alarm occurs when police are dispatched and no physical evidence of a burglary, unauthorized entry, robbery, or other crime(s), are apparent where the alarm system was activated.

False alarms can be avoided by cancelling the dispatch prior to police personnel arrival. Excessive false alarms often subject the assessment of civil fines.



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What are the Fees and Fines In case of a False Alarm?

Fees and fines can vary depending on local municipality. Often fines are the result of failure to register your alarm or excessive false alarms. Most counties will not charge for the first two false alarms. Costs may vary for senior citizens, veterans, and businesses.
